

RESOLUTION NO. R-5-2013

ACCEPTING THE CAMP W.G. WILLIAMS JOINT LAND USE STUDY (JLUS) FINAL REPORT AND ENDORSING AND SUPPORTING THE STRATEGIES THEREIN AS RECOMMENDED BY THE CAMP WILLIAMS JLUS POLICY COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, Camp Williams is recognized by all jurisdictions as an important asset to the nation's defense, National Guard and Reserve Units, and state and local agencies, and with knowledge that the installation is the premier training facility in the Western United States due to its wide array of live-fire and maneuvering training ranges and its similar terrain to combat theaters in Middle Eastern countries; and,

WHEREAS, the training at Camp Williams is affected by growth and development along the perimeter of the installation and the necessity of compatible land use has become an essential element in preserving and protecting the quality and quantity of the training being conducted at the Camp; and,

WHEREAS, in promoting compatible land use to protect the mission of Camp Williams and the public safety and welfare of surrounding communities—the importance of private property rights is recognized and will be respected in this process; and,

WHEREAS, without an effective training site at Camp Williams the overall arms and ground, basic airborne, land navigation, and helicopter maneuvering training of the nation's defense could potentially be constrained contributing to the potential downgrading of other training missions located at other military installations including other National Guard and Reserve units, and other units and groups who use Camp Williams for training; and,

WHEREAS, Camp Williams, through the Department of Defense, generated \$57.3 Million in 2011 for the local economic impact, and the training conducted at Camp Williams is vital not only to our national security but to the economic security of Eagle Mountain City and the surrounding communities; and,

WHEREAS, the Camp Williams Joint Land Use Study was initiated in April 2011 with support from the City of Bluffdale, Town of Cedar Fort, Eagle Mountain City, City of Herriman, Lehi City, City of Saratoga Springs, County of Salt Lake, County of Utah, and Camp Williams; and

WHEREAS, the Camp Williams JLUS Policy and Technical Committees, composed of elected officials, technical experts, and interested stakeholders, have been actively involved in the process and have had the opportunity to collaborate and work towards win-win solutions and recommendations as detailed in the study for each jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the final JLUS report has recommended various compatibility strategies to help preserve the mission of Camp Williams to reduce potential loss of operations and missions in the future resulting from incompatible land use around the installation; and,


WHEREAS, the Camp Williams JLUS Policy Committee has recommended that the JLUS local government partners adopt a resolution to accept the JLUS report and support the community initiatives as described in the study.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF EAGLE MOUNTAIN:

1. The City Council of Eagle Mountain does hereby endorse and support the mission of Camp W.G. Williams and accepts the Joint Use Land Study (JLUS) Report; and
2. The City Council of Eagle Mountain recommends each JLUS local government partner accept the Final JLUS report and adopt a similar resolution endorsing and supporting the recommendations related to their community.
3. The City Council of Eagle Mountain will take the necessary steps to act in good faith to implement the applicable Camp Williams JLUS recommendations.
4. This resolution shall be transmitted to each JLUS partnering local government, Camp Williams, and the DoD Office of Economic Adjustment, upon adoption.
