**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF
THE TOWN OF EAGLE MOUNTAIN, UTAH AUTHORIZING
A LOW POWER F.M. (LPFM) RADIO STATION LICENSE
WITHIN THE TOWN OF EAGLE MOUNTAIN
FOR THE BENEFIT OF ITS CITIZENS**

The Town Council of the Town of Eagle Mountain, Utah finds that

WHEREAS, a LPFM radio station would provide our citizens with a source of local safety and emergency information unavailable through any other mass media outlet; and

WHEREAS, our citizens would be provided with information concerning their local government (such as broadcasting our Town Council and Planning Commission meetings and upcoming agendas); and

WHEREAS, a LPFM radio station would provide an outlet for community comment and discussion on issues of local importance; and

WHEREAS, a LPFM radio station would provide a method of expression and information dissemination for our local citizens and organizations (Community Arts Council, Town Library, Arts and Crafts, Pony Express Days Celebration, etc.); and

WHEREAS, a LPFM radio station would provide training and experience for our citizens interested in pursuing a career in broadcasting or broadcast engineering; and

WHEREAS, a LPFM radio station would provide a means for our local talent to demonstrate and perfect their craft (musical, literary, program hosting, and narrative/editorial comment); and

WHEREAS, a LPFM radio station would provide a source of community pride and cohesion; and

WHEREAS, a LPFM radio station would provide a means of recognition to community members whose efforts warrant public praise (public service awards, honorary decrees, etc.).


NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Town Council of the Town Eagle Mountain, Utah as follows:


1. We strongly believe that the Low Power FM Initiative (LFPM) would significantly benefit our community.
2. We believe that these benefits stated in the findings are of far greater value to the common good than protecting the audience share of existing commercially licensed high power broadcast stations who, of necessity, have program content tailored for a larger, regional audience.
