RESOLUTION NO. R 18-2001

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF
EAGLE MOUNTAIN CITY, UTAH
TO ESTABLISH A JUSTICE COURT**

WHEREAS, Eagle Mountain City is entitled under the provisions of Title 78, Chapter 5, Utah Code, to elect to create a Class IV Justice Court to serve the City; and

WHEREAS, the current Utah County Justice Court may become unavailable to the City because of the unavailability of prosecution services by the Utah County attorney; and

WHEREAS, establishing a Justice Court requires compliance with operating standards established by Utah Code and the Utah Judicial Council; and

WHEREAS, establishment of the Justice Court requires certification by the Utah Judicial Council of the Justice Court of Eagle Mountain City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Eagle Mountain City believes that it is in the public interest to establish a Justice Court for Eagle Mountain City.


NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of Eagle Mountain City, Utah as follows:


1. The Mayor and City Administrator are hereby authorized to cause the creation and filing of all documents necessary to establish a Justice Court for Eagle Mountain City as a Class IV Justice Court.
2. The Mayor and City Administrator are hereby authorized to file a written declaration with the Judicial Council of the intent of the City to establish the Justice Court and to request that the Utah Judicial Council shorten the time required between the written declaration and the effective date of the election by the City to establish the Justice Court for Eagle Mountain City.
3. The Justice Court for Eagle Mountain City shall have territorial jurisdiction over all Class "B" and "C" misdemeanors, violations of ordinances, and infractions committed within the boundaries of Eagle Mountain City, except those offenses over which the juvenile court has exclusive jurisdiction.
